Today, 20 years later, we are deeply grateful to our Founders Circle, inaugural executive director Jay Furfaro and esteemed board of directors! Their vision continues to inspire leaders to step up and take the helm to support Kaua'i's people.

Twenty years of leadership development on Kaua'i, results are alumni serving as:

Elected public officials – Kaua'i County Mayor; County Council Chair, Vice-Chair and members; volunteers on County Boards & Commissions; appointed roles in County and State agencies; selected executive directors and presidents of non-profits and businesses; business owners; and many more in highly influential positions within their companies and organizations.

Program Highlights - 19 adult cohorts, 61 community projects, 6 youth Pi'ina Hoku cohorts, high school leadership curriculum for nearly 2000 students & teachers, online training expansions, coaching, train-the-trainers, collaborations, facilitations and partnership building throughout the islands, statewide and globally.

LK Annual Class Update:

- June 2023 graduated 20 leaders who modeled the way on collaborative leadership. They held each other accountable to group values and persevered by relying on their "we can do this" spirit. Two impactful community projects: housing & homelessness 2023 Landlord Summit, and educational youth videos in their mission to Get Learning with LK Ed.
- September began our 20th cohort with 21 diverse leaders. Imagine seasoned leaders, new supervisors, and island newcomers working to create meaningful community projects. We anticipate a year of oohs, ahhs and sighs, as they dive into making sense of Kaua'i's current issues on employment, tourism, transportation, government and more. Community project topics are financial literacy, westside youth activities, and food security.

Kaua'i's ability to rally quickly during a crisis is a reflection of years of cooperative leadership in the spirit of Aloha. Your support has been tremendous, and we humbly ask for your continued enthusiam to robustly usher in the next 20 years.
