William Cathers is an educator, speaker, consultant and intellectual coach. He has also designed and moderated a variety of seminars for The Aspen Institute, an internationally recognized think tank and leadership training organization and was a protégé of the institute's intellectual architect, Dr. Mortimer J. Adler.

"As an academic, I'm surrounded by intellectuals. But for many years, I have not participated in a conversation that was as intellectually stimulating as the ones facilitated by Bill Cathers at *The Aspen Institute*. In the 1980's, Bill developed, directed, and was lead teacher of the *Options Enrichment Program*, an alternative high school program for at-risk youth based on the principles of Dr. Adler's *Paideia Program*. Students included expulsion cases, dropouts, pregnant minors, as well as others released from jail. In 1989, Mr. Cathers entered two teams of these students into the United States Academic Decathlon, a rigorous, nation-wide intellectual competition. Competing against the top students from the regular high schools, *Options* won six medals, placed in the top ten in the Super Quiz, and won the music category with a record-setting team score.

Due to the success and acclaim of the *Options Enrichment Program*,
Mr. Cathers created his second educational program, the *High Intellectual Preparedness*Program. HIPP providesworkshops for high school students and teachers in Los Angeles and has helped produced dramatic improvement of test scores across a variety of subjects.

Each summer during college, Bill worked for legendary UCLA coach John Wooden at his youth basketball camps; and upon graduating from college, played professional basketball in Europe.

Mr. Cathers' uniquebackground in academics, athletics, and fine arts enables him to provide a versatile and inspiring approach as a consultant,

educator, coach, writer and speaker.
